Currently most schools are test optional

- PSAT
- <u>SAT</u>
- <u>ACT</u>



PSAT: Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test

- "Practice" for SAT given on the 3rd Saturday in October
- Provides starting range for future SAT scores and identifies areas that need improvement
- Indicator for future AP coursework
- Recommended for juniors (National Merit Scholarship)
- Register in fall of 10th and 11th grade
- Let your counselor know if you qualify for accommodations (Chapter 15, IEPs etc.)
- Fee: \$20, waivers available

SAT www.collegeboard.org

- Required for 4 year college applications
- Recommended in the spring of the 11th grade
- Re-tests are available in fall of 12th grade
- About 3 hours & 50 min
- Evidenced Based Reading & Writing (EBRW)
 - Reading comprehension and sentence completion
- Math sections
 - Algebra, Geometry, Probability & Statistics

Which test to take...

- SAT & the ACT are accepted by colleges & universities
- Take the PSAT & compare your results to scores that colleges recommend
- If doing well on the PSAT, stick with the SAT
- If not, or in doubt, take both the SAT and ACT on different months
- Re-tests are available
- Superscore: the best scores are used by colleges
 - Both sets of scores must be reported

SAT/ACT

- Scores sent directly to Colleges
 - Up to 4 score reports will be free if prior to test or within 9 days following the test date.
 - It will generally take 3 weeks for reports to be sent
 - After testing window, cost is \$12 for each report sent
- Colleges require scores to be sent directly from College Board or ACT
- Ex: Pitt, PSU & NCAA...so check with your school.
- Scores are NOT reported on high school transcript

- SAT/ACT not needed. Can replace placement test

- Optional bachelor completion program
 - Articulation agreements with colleges are updated annually.
 - BC3 visits the SHS monthly to meet w/students & answer questions.

Freshman & Sophomore Year Priorities...

- Challenging academic schedule
- Grades
- Extracurricular activities
 - Example: music, sports (NCAA), clubs
- Create a resume in Xello listing school achievements & school participation. Ex: job/volunteering
- See Counselor for career interview (scheduling, college testing & school information)

Junior Year Priorities...

- Increase level of difficulty of classes
- 1
- Ex: Academic to Honors, Honors to A.P.
- Review credits and scheduling with Counselor
- Continue resume in English class with Xello (list of activities, both curricular & extra-curricular, including leadership positions)

Junior Year Priorities...

- Have a "family discussion" about schools
 - size, location, distance from home, cost
 - check out <u>My Smart Borrowing</u>
- Attend College Fair in September
- Research colleges noting their admissions requirements including SAT/ACT, GPA, & language requirements (Info can be found in Xello)
- Ask tough Q's (retention rates, job outlook,# of openings, % of placement in field)

Junior Year Priorities...

- Take the PSAT in October & discuss scores with counselor
- Schedule SAT and/or ACT if required.
- NCAA eligibility see handout
 - www.eligibilitycenter.org
 - -\$90



- Make appointments with admissions offices to interview & tour campuses
- Send "thank you" letters to interviewer
- Finalize resume using *Xello* to format & print professionally
 - included with your applications
 - use if requesting a letter of recommendation

Senior Year Priorities...

- Complete college applications
 - Most completed online
 - fees charged, essays uploaded, transcripts uploaded for free
 - Student must notify counselor to send electronically or sign a transcript request form and provide postage fee if mailing
 - Pay attention to decision deadlines (early decision, early action, regular decision)

Senior Year Priorities...

Confirm college choices by May 1st & notify declined colleges

- Miscellaneous:
 - Register for Advanced Placement (A.P.) exams that will be given in May
 - Final transcript will be sent to college of choice

BC3 Early College Pioneer Program

- -Beginning with 20-21, seniors had the opportunity to spend their first 3 periods of the high school day on campus at Butler County Community College taking BC3 Freshman English classes, Speech, and Microeconomics for dual credit
- -14 credits for FREE (thanks to a grant)

Letters of Recommendation

- Required by more selective schools
- Ask two of the following:
 - -teachers, manager, counselor or coach
 - -provide them a copy of your resume or complete the Recommendation Letter Form
- Give a minimum of 2 weeks notice
- Write thank you note

Senior Year Priorities...

- Take a full "academic" and challenging schedule
- Attend the College Fair in September
- Register for the SAT, ACT if necessary

Financial Aid

There are 3 sources of aid:

- 1. <u>Institutional</u>: identified through FAFSA, awarded by colleges or universities in the form of a financial aid package
- 2. <u>Scholarships</u> local & national
 - **Local**: available in guidance office and online in February, bulletins will be sent to senior homerooms announcing the different scholarships available
 - **National**: posted on the <u>SHS guidance</u> website, start fall of Senior Year or sooner

3. <u>Educational Loans</u>:

- Through financial aid office of college, after FAFSA completion
- Through private lenders (banks & credit unions)

Financial Aid

- Complete <u>FAFSA</u> (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) after October 1st
- Income tax & asset information is necessary
 - Filing deadline is May 1st
 - Financial information determines "Expected Family
 Contribution" (same regardless of college selection)
 - The EFC is deducted from the total cost of attendance to determine financial need (net price calculator)
 - Attend FAFSA workshop at Senior High in October
- Some schools also require the <u>CSS Profile</u> contact individual financial aid offices to be sure



Financial Aid cont.

 A financial aid package may consist of grants & scholarships, work study & low interest loans

• Each college offers their own financial aid package
